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1. What Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablet is and what it is used for?

Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets are Expectorant, helps relieve symptoms of respiratory tract inflammation associated with cough

2. Before you take Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablet

Do not take Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets

- if you are allergic to ivy, plants belonging to the aralia family, such as Schefflera, Panax ginseng or Eleutherococcus senticosus or any of the other ingredients of this medicine (listed in section 6)

Warnings and precautions

Talk to your doctor or pharmacist before taking Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets When dyspnoea, fever, bloody or purulent sputum occurs, a he consulted

Caution is recommended in patients with gastritis or gastric ulcer

You must talk to a doctor if you do not feel better after one week or if you feel worse

Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets are not intended for use in children under 6 years

Other medicines and Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets

No interaction studies have been performed.

Tell your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking / using, have recently taken / used or might take / use any other medicines

Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets with food and drink

The product should be used after a meal

Pregnancy and breast-feeding

If you are pregnant or breast-feeding, think you may be pregnant or are planning to have a baby, ask your doctor or pharmacist for advice before taking this medicine. Safety during pregnancy and lactation has not been established. In the absence of

sufficient data, the use during pregnancy and lactation is not recommended

No fertility data are available

Driving and using machines

No studies on the effect on the ability to drive and use machines have been performed.

Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets contain sodium.

This medicine contains 316 mg sodium (main component of cooking / table salt) in each

effervescent tablet. This is equivalent to 15.8 % of the recommended maximum daily dietary intake of sodium for an adult.

The maximum daily dose of this medicinal product contains 632 mg sodium (main component of cooking / table salt). This is equivalent to 31.6 % of the recommended

maximum daily dietary intake of sodium for an adult.

Talk to your doctor or pharmacist if you need 2 effervescent tablets daily for a prolonged period, especially if you have been advised to follow a low salt (sodium) diet

Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets contain macrogolglycerol hydroxystearate. Macrogolglycerol hydroxystearate may cause stomach upset and diarrhoea Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets contain glucose.

If you have been told by your doctor that you have an intolerance to some sugars, contact your doctor before taking this medicinal product.

3. How to take Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets

Always take this medicine exactly as described in this leaflet or as your doctor or pharmacist has told you. Check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure Unless prescribed otherwise by your doctor, the recommended dose is:
Adolescents aged 12 years and above, adults and elderly

should take one effervescent tablet (corresponding to 50 mg of ivy leaves dry extract) twice daily (in the morning and evening).

Children from 6 to 11 years of age should take half an effervescent tablet (corresponding to 25 mg of ivy leaves dry extract)

twice daily (in the morning and evening).

This product is not intended for use in children under 6 years of age

Store the second half of the effervescent tablet in the closed sachet until the next application (max. 24 hours).

The open edge area of the sachet is closed by folding over twice The tablet can be divided into equal doses

Insufficient data are available to permit specific dose recommendations in the case of impaired kidney/liver function.

Method of administration:

Dissolve the effervescent tablet in half a glass of water and drink after eating Duration of use:

If the symptoms persist longer than one week during the use of the medicinal product, a doctor or a pharmacist should be consulted.

If you take more Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets than you should
There are normally no adverse effects if one effervescent tablet more than recommended is taken

Nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea and restlessness can develop if considerably more tablets

One case of a 4-year-old child who developed aggressivity and diarrhoea after accidental intake of an ivy extract corresponding to six effervescent tablets has been reported. You should consult your doctor in such a ca

If you forget to take Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets

Do not take a double dose to make up for a forgotten dose

4. Possible side effects

Like all medicines, this medicine can cause side effects, although not everybody gets

The following list covers all the known side effects from treatment with extract of ivy leaves, including those from higher doses and long-term treatment. Possible side effects:

Gastrointestinal reactions (nausea vomiting diarrhoea) have been reported. The frequency is not known

Allergic reactions (urticaria, skin rash, dyspnoea, anaphylactic reaction) have been reported. The frequency is not known

If other adverse reactions not mentioned above occur, a doctor or a pharmacist should be consulted

If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor or pharmacist. This includes any possible side effects not listed in this leaflet.

5. How to store Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets

- Keep this medicine out of the sight and reach of children. Store below 25 °C,
- Do not use this medicine after the expiry date which is stated on the carton and contained
- after "EXP". The expiry date refers to the last day of that month.
- Store in the original package in order to protect from moisture.
 Shelf life after first opening is 24 hours.
- Do not throw away any medicines via wastewater or household waste. Ask your pharmacist how to throw away medicines you no longer use. These measures will help protect the environment

What Co-pan Cough Effervescent Tablets contain

The active substance is ivy leaf dry extract.

Each effervescent tablet contains 50 mg of dry extract from Hedera helix L., folium (ivy leaves) (4-8:1), extraction solvent; ethanol 30% (m/m)

The other ingredients are

Anhydrous citric acid (Ph. Eur.), sodium hydrogen carbonate (Ph. Eur.), mannitol (Ph. Eur.), anhydrous sodium carbonate (Ph. Eur.), saccharin sodium (Ph. Eur.), sodium cyclamate (Ph. Eur.), simeticone (Ph. Eur.), medium-chain triglycerides (Ph. Eur.), sodium citrate (Ph. Eur.), macrogolglycerol hydroxystearate (Ph. Eur.), beetroot po Colertonis ap concentrate (E 162), mallodextrin (Ph. Eur.), citic acid monohydrate (Ph. Eur.)), encicaini powder (anthocyanin extract from grape skin (E 163), glucose syrup), blackcurrant flavour (ethyl butyrate, raspherry ketone, finaloci, hexenyl acetate c-3, menthol, L-, maltodextrin, propylene glycol (E 1520), modified starch (E 1450)).
