1. What Zencin is and what it is used for

- Anonin contains azithromycin which is one of a group of antibiotics known as macrolides. It is used to treat bacterial infections caused by micro organisms such as bacteria. These infections inductive infections inductive. Chest infections such as bronchitis and pneumonia. Infections in your sinuses, throat tonsis or ears. Mild to moderate skin and soft tissue infections, e.g., infection of the hair follicles (folliculitis), bacterial infection of the skin and its deeper layers (cellulitis), skin infection with shiny red swelling (eyspipelas). Sexually transmitted disease caused by organisms called Chlamydia trachomatis and Neisseria gonorrhoea.

2. What you need to know before you take Zencin

Do not take Zencin

If you are allergic to azilhromycin, any other macrolide (such as enythromycin or clarithromycin) or teologic antibiotic or any of the ingredients of this medicine (listed in section 8). An allergic reaction may cause skin rash or wheezing.

Warnings and precautions

Talk to your doctor or pharmacist before taking Zencin if you:

Nave ever had a serious allergic reaction causings welling of the face and throat, possibly with breathing problems, rash, fever, swollen glands or increase in eosinophils (certain type of white blood cells).

Nave severe kidney problems; your doctor may alter the dose.

Nave liver problems your doctor may need to monitor your liver function or stop the treatment.

Nave myasthenia gravis (localised muscle weakness).

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 have myastenia gravis (localised muscle wasteness)

 have been diagnosed with a neurological disease, which is a disease of the brain or neurous system.

 have mental, emotional or behavioural problems.

 are taking medicines known as egot alialoids (such as ergotamine), which are used to treat migraine: azithromycin is not recommended (see 'Other medicines and Zencin below).

 Since azithromycin may increase the risk of abnormal heart rhytim please tell your doctor if you have any of the following problems before taking this medicine (especially you are female or alderly);

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 are taking medicines known as antiarrhythmics (e.g. quinidine, procainamide, dofetilide, amiodarone, sotaloit used to treat abnormal heart rhythmis; cispanice (used to treat stomach problems) or terinadine (an antihistamine that is used to treat alteripes) or antipsycholic agents (e.g. pimozide), amidepressants (e

- Antaois (for indigestion): Zencin should be taken at least 1 hour before or 2 hours after the antaoid.

- Cisapride (for stomach problems), Ierfenadine (used to treat hay fever): concomitant use with azithromycin may cause heart disorders.

- Medicines for irregular heart beat (called anti-arrythmics), or to lower cholesterol (called statins) such as actorvastalin.

- Alfentantal (used for narcoss) or astemizoid (used to treat hay fever): concomitant use with azithromycin any increase the effect of these medicinal products.

3. How to take Zencin

Always take this medicine exactly as your doctor or pharmacist has told you. Check w doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure. Azithromycin tables should be given as a single daily dose. The tablets should be sw. preferably with a drink of water, and can be taken with or without food.

Zencin 500mg: The tablet **can't** be divided into equal doses. The recommended dose is:

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Adults (including older patients), children and adolescents with a body weight of over 45 kg:
The recommended dose is 1500 mg divided over either 3 or 5 days as follows:

*When taken over 5 days, 500 mg as a single dose on the first day and then 250 mg once daily.

*When taken over 5 days, 500 mg as a single dose on the first day and then 250 mg once daily on days 2 through to 5.

*Indiammation of the urethra or cervix caused by Chiamydia. 1000 mg taken as a single dose, for one day only.

*Eor infections in your sinuses, treatment is indicated for adults and adolescents 16 years of age and over.

*Children and adolescents with a body weight of 45 kg and under:

*Tablets are not indicated for these patients. Other pharmaceutical forms of azithromycin-containing products (e.g. suspensions) may be used.

*Patients with ôthery or liver problems.

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*Always continue with the course event if you feel better. If your infection gets worse or you do not start to feel better within a few days or a new infection develops, go back and see your doctor.

Hyous take more Zencin than you should.

If you take more Zencin than you should
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If you do someone else) swallow a lot of the tablets altogether, or if you think a child has swal
lowed any of the tablets, contact your doctor or pharmacist immediately. An overdose is likely

If you forget to take Zencin
If you forget to take a tablet, take one as soon as you remember, unless it is nearly time to
take the next one. Do not take a double dose to make up for a forgotten dose.
If you stop taking Zencin
Do not stop taking Zencin
Do not stop taking your medicine without talking to your doctor first even if you feel better.
It is very important that you keep taking Zencin for as long as your doctor has told you to;
otherwise the infection may come back.
If you have any further questions on the use of this product, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

4. Possible side effects

Like all medicines, this medicine can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them. If the following happens, stop taking the tablets and tell your doctor immediately or go to the Emergency department at your nearest hospital:

Uncommon (may affect up to 1 in 100 people):

- A severe skin reaction causing bilsters/bleeding of the lips, eyes, nose, mouth and genitals (Stevens-Johnson syndrome).

- yellowing of the skin and whites of the eyes, tiredness and loss of appetite which may be caused by inflammation of the liver (hepatitis).

Rare (may affect up to 1 in 1,000 people):
- yellowing of the skin or eyes (gundrice).
- skin eruption that is characterised by the rapid appearance of areas of red skin studded with small pusheds (and bill sters filled with whitelyellow fluid).

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5. How to store Zencin

- Keep this medicine out of the sight and reach of children.
 Store below 30°C.
 Do not use this medicine after the expiry date which is stated on the label and carton. The expiry date refers to the last day of that month.

What Zencin film-coated tablet contains

The active substance is azilthomycin.
Each tablet contains either 250 mg or 500 mg of the active ingredient azithromycin (as Azilthomycin Dihydrate). The other ingredients are: Microcrystalline Cellulose, Pregelatinised Maize Starch, Sodium Launyl Sulphate, Dibasic Calcium Phosphate Anhydrous, Croscarmellose Sodium, Povidone K30, Magnesium Stearate and Opadry White.

What Zencin looks like and contents of the pack
Zencin 250 mg tablets are white capsule shaped, bloonvex, film coated tablet debossed with
**(125° on one side and plain on the other side.
Zencin 500 mg tablets are white capsule shaped, bloonvex, film coated tablet debossed with
**(264° on one side and ½' on the other side.

The 250 mg tablets are available in pack size of 6 tablets in two blister strips.
**The 500 mg tablets are available in pack size of 3 tablets in one blister strip.
